In the entertainment industry, Trinity has worked with several independent movie producers, writers and artists. He has also represented some of the largest privately owned companies in the United States, as well as many local businesses, contractors and individuals in government investigations.

During his tenure there, he wrote three books and spoke to congregations at over 200 churches and events around the world.
